## **Application**

The Department of Psychology presents a number of awards to outstanding senior psychology majors who have gone beyond the confines of the classroom in applying psychology related skills in community service and research settings. To be considered for an **Allport Scholar Award**, students must complete at least two activities in each of the following skill areas: computer/technology, written communication, research methodology, oral communication. In addition, students must document that the issue of diversity or individual differences was addressed in at least one of the aforementioned skill areas.

Students wishing to be considered for the Allport Scholar Award should submit the following materials to Linda Galbato no later than **April 4, 2012**.

- 1) Complete the Allport Skills Checklist (see below).
- 2) Prepare a single spaced typed essay (not to exceed 2 pages) describing how these experiences impacted your personal and academic development and briefly explaining how your activities satisfy the Allport skill areas.
- 3) Submit an updated copy of your resume or curriculum vitae.

A committee of the psychology department faculty will review the nominations and will announce successful candidates on **April 11, 2012**.
